

2022 STATE POLICY PRIORITIES

Overarching Priorities:

Equality & Racial Justice: Dismantle racism & inequity across BIPOC child care professionals and working families, both long-term and new residents (e.g., refugees)

Recovery & Stabilization: Build a stronger Early Childhood Education (ECE) system post COVID-19
especially in hard-hit Black and Latinx communities

SUSTAINABILITY



Increase Compensation Develop new base rate that considers true cost of quality care



Mixed Delivery System Sustain and grow child care options that meet family needs & support the development of the whole child



Affordability

Support Legislation to cap family costs for child care at no more than 7% of income



Local Funding

Partner with local government to leverage equitable, affordable & sustainable child care

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT



Workforce Capacity Support investment in child care provider and staff recruitment in <u>all</u> child care settings



Resource & Referral (R&R) Support the critical role of the R&R system as community-centered support for families, essential workers, & child care professionals



Development

Expand resources founded on best practices training on trauma-informed care and family strengthening initiatives

FAMILY SUPPORT



Under-Resourced Families

Increase child care access & investments to under-resourced families



Access to Care

Eliminate family fees and provide additional child care vouchers to serve all eligible families



Eligibility

Advocate to streamline eligibility across multiple systems for family services and support

INFRASTRUCTURE



Federal, State, & Local Government

Strengthen collaboration with & support of federal, state, and local agencies



Data Systems

Partner with state agencies to streamline technology systems & integration of ECE Workforce Registry



Facilities

Invest in & expand child care settings, especially in highest need communities



Universal TK/Pre-K

Involve R&R and AP system to achieve comprehensive child care and ECE services

Union Relations

Strengthen partnership with labor to advocate for a more equitable system that meets needs of all child care professionals and working families

Advocating for more than 40,000 eligible children waiting for care

Investing more than \$500 million across Los Angeles County for child care and early learning

One of our top priorities is to rebuild and strengthen the child care system after the devastation of COVID-19. The Impact on ECE has been huge, as shown by the chart below:

In May of 2020, less than half of all licensed providers were open. As of December of 2021, 83% of licensed providers have reopened.
